Who is the intended audience for the Uponor Convention | Radiant Cooling Engineering Summit?

What are the session topics and who are the presenters?

Peter Simmonds, Ph.D., will explore the engineering of radiant cooling projects and a case study review of the Cooper Union project in New York City. Peter will highlight radiant system design, installation and control strategies that can be successfully applied to mechanical designs.

What's included in my convention fee?

Yes. Attendees who wish to extend their stay to include Saturday night may do so at their own expense. Reserve your rooms through the Uponor Convention registration site, and then pay directly to the Bellagio Las Vegas at arrival or departure. The Uponor-negotiated rate for Saturday is \$169 plus tax based on double occupancy. All extension requests are based on availability at the time of booking.

What's the dress code?

For the business portion of the meeting and Friday's cocktail reception, business casual (khakis and golf shirts) is appropriate. For Thursday's cocktail reception, The Bank night club's dress code will be enforced. No hats, oversized jeans, baggy clothing or athletic wear.
